CHICAGO – February 27, 2023 – <u>The Peninsula Chicago</u> hotel and the Beth Rudin DeWoody Collection, in alignment with <u>EXPO CHICAGO</u>, today announced *Neo Chicago*, a public contemporary art exhibition highlighting the renowned personal art collection of Beth Rudin DeWoody featuring works purchased over the course of several decades by the collector from galleries rooted in Chicago. On view in the public spaces of The Peninsula Chicago beginning April 14 timed to the opening of the modern and contemporary art fair EXPO CHICAGO, the exhibition is open to the public 24 hours per day through May 2023 as part of the ongoing collaboration between the three organizations.

Neo Chicago will celebrate a number of Chicago's contemporary art galleries and their commitment to fostering artist practices from around the world. The exhibition extends a dialogue that originated in 2016, when The Peninsula hosted an exhibition from DeWoody's collection titled Whoville, which featured Chicago-based artists in DeWoody's collection. Neo Chicago further explores DeWoody's decades-long support of Chicago's cultural spaces and emphasizes the global impact of the city's robust gallery ecosystem. The exhibition also includes a special installation by Ebony G. Patterson on loan from the collection of Beth Rudin DeWoody's daughter, Kyle DeWoody.

"I was thrilled to be a part of *Whoville* at The Peninsula Hotel in 2016, and I was particularly excited when Tony Karman and the hotel invited me to show my collection again," said DeWoody. "It's always wonderful to bring my art to a new audience. Loaning my collection is a meaningful extension of my collecting overall. With the tremendous help of Laura Dvorkin and Maynard Monrow, we came up with the idea to focus on Chicago galleries this year. Chicago is indeed one of my favorite cities. It's a place where extraordinary art is created and first shown to the world."

About the Exhibition

DeWoody has been acquiring art from the city since the 1980s while Art Chicago was held at Navy Pier. The works in the exhibition mutually display DeWoody's style of collecting—sometimes playful, sometimes visceral, and always thought provoking. It is a curated vignette of what one would see at her residence or private art space *The Bunker*, which opened in 2017.

The galleries represented in the exhibition (Corbett Vs. Dempsey, Mariane Ibrahim, Shane

Campbell Gallery, PATRON Gallery, Monique Meloche Gallery, Kavi Gupta Gallery, and Rhona Hoffman Gallery) are equally an integral part of the art world's ecosystem, often mounting experimental shows and solo exhibitions of an artist's work well before they have reached national acclaim. Both DeWoody and these dynamic, contemporary galleries share a passion for supporting today's international emerging artists.

Neo Chicago features work by a group of culturally diverse, intergenerational artists, all of whom have made their mark on the city. Artists Angel Otero and Jimmy Wright have spent their formative years studying at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, while others have taught in the city or called it their home (McArthur Binion, Celeste Rapone, Laura Davis, Omar Velázquez, Carlos Rolón/Dzine, Claire Zeisler, and Ebony G. Patterson). It is where artists such as Kennedy Yanko, Kendell Carter, David Antonio Cruz, Ayana V. Jackson, Clotide Jiménez, Samuel Levi Jones, Ryosuke Kumakura, Jason Middlebrook, Adam Pendleton, and Kour Pour exhibited important works—and it was at the Art Institute of Chicago where Amy Sherald presented her most notable painting to date—a portrait of the former First Lady Michelle Obama, commissioned by the National Portrait Gallery.

The culture of a place is often defined by its "renaissance" period. Chicago's Golden Age has been defined as 1890-1930, established by its developments in modern architecture or even the 1990s "Golden Age" of basketball. This exhibition suggests that perhaps the work being created and shown in Chicago today (and in its recent years) are yet another Golden Age—the *Neo Chicago*.
