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# 11<sup>TH</sup> EDITION OF EXPO CHICAGO ANIMATES THE MARKET WITH SALES ACROSS THE BOARD, DEEPENING TIES WITH CITY

CHICAGO—**EXPO CHICAGO** concluded its 11<sup>th</sup> edition on Sunday, April 14, following robust attendance from collectors, curators, and museum directors, totaling over 35,000 visitors. This year the fair saw lively sales across 170 leading galleries from 29 countries and 75 cities. In its first year as part of the Frieze network, EXPO CHICAGO reaffirmed its position as a convening moment for Chicago's creative and philanthropic communities, showcasing the depth and breadth of the city's cultural landscape.

"In our 11th edition of EXPO CHICAGO, we are grateful to now be part of the Frieze family. There was a tangible sense of excitement around this year's edition, a sentiment echoed by our patrons and gallerists, translating into strong sales and an energized atmosphere at the fair and throughout the city," said **Tony Karman**, President and Director of EXPO CHICAGO. "As always, EXPO CHICAGO's overall success was amplified by the overwhelming support of Chicago's civic and cultural community who align with us each year to welcome the world."

"It was a pleasure to join our colleagues in Chicago this week for EXPO's latest edition. The fair was invigorated by the enhanced layout, demonstrating our commitment to supporting exhibiting galleries, from established to emerging," shared **Kristell Chadé**, Executive Director of Fairs at Frieze. "The ongoing enthusiastic exchange between gallerists, patrons and curators was bolstered by EXPO CHICAGO's deep relationships with the city and its cherished institutions."

The fair's opening night proved itself to be a platform for civic engagement, with the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago's Vernissage raising more than \$265,000 for the Museum's learning programs.

#### **REPORTED SALES**

Major sales were reported by multiple galleries. **McCormick Gallery** sold a painting by **Mary Abbott** for \$525,000 and a painting by **Perle Fine** for \$195,000; **Sundaram Tagore** sold paintings by multiple artists, including **Hiroshi Senju** for \$385,000; **Miles McEnery Gallery** sold a painting by **Wolf Kahn** for \$150,000; **Kasmin** reported sales priced in the range of \$20,000 to \$200,000, which included a drawing by **Henri Matisse**, a multi-media work by **Diana Al-Hadid**, and paintings by **Vanessa German**, **Theodora Allen**, and **Lyn Liu**; **Michael Kohn Gallery** sold eight paintings by **Nir Hod** in the range of \$24,000 to \$135,000; **Timothy Yarger Fine Art** | **YARGER PROJECTS** sold a light sculpture by **Mads Christensen** for \$175,000; **Catharine Clark Gallery** sold a textile by **Marie Watt** for \$135,000; **Gana Art** sold works including **Chiharu Shiota**'s *Endless Line* for \$121,000; **Hakgojae** sold a wood sculpture by **YUN Suknam** for \$100,000; **Galerie Judin**'s noteworthy sales included a painting by **Cornelia**  Schleime for \$100,000; and St. Louis-based William Shearburn Gallery sold a vessel by Toshiko Takaezu for \$100,000.

Sold out presentations included **Spinello Projects**, who placed all of their paintings by **Nereida Garcia-Ferraz** in a range of \$5,000 to \$22,000; **The Hole** sold out of their booth with a solo presentation by artist **Joseph Parra**, each priced \$12,000; Chicago-based gallery **moniquemeloche** sold all of their works by artist and SAIC graduate **Luke Agada; Make Room** reported to have sold out their booth of paintings by Cathleen Clarke priced from \$4,500 to \$13,000; and **TERN** gallery completely sold their presentation of mixed-media works by **Kachelle Knowles** on the first day.

In addition to the sales noted above, **William Shearburn Gallery** sold paintings by **Friedel Dzubas and Donald Baechler** for \$85,000 and \$35,000, respectively; **ACA Galleries** sold multiple artworks by artist **Faith Ringgold** in the range of \$75,000 to \$85,000; **Michael Kohn Gallery** sold a work by **Lita Albuquerque** for \$75,000 among other notable sales; **Sundaram Tagore** sold pieces including a painting by **Jane Kee** for \$70,000, an artwork by **Ricardo Mazal** for \$30,000, and a painting by **Karen Knorr** for \$40,000; **Miles McEnery Gallery** also sold a **Wolf Kahn** painting and \$55,000; and **Tim Yarger Fine Art** sold a **Mads Christensen** Light Sculpture for \$32,500.

Perrotin Gallery reported sales including a historical Sophie Calle artwork for \$80,000; Addis Fine Art sold multiple artworks by Merikokeb Berhanu ranging from \$60,000 to \$70,000; Edwynn Houk Gallery sold a historic Dorothea Lange photograph for \$65,000; Martin Art Projects sold a painting by Mohau Modisakeng for \$35,000 to the North Dakota Museum of Art; Eric Firestone Gallery sold multiple works by Huê Thi Hoffmaster between \$30,000 and \$55,000, as well as a Cato work for \$25,000; Ryan Lee Gallery sold works by Tim Braden in the range of \$45,000 to \$65,000; and Zidoun-Bossuyt Gallery sold a painting by Yashua Klos ranging from \$40,000 to \$50,000.
